INTRODUCTION

The University Panthéon-Assas, through SORBONNE-ASSAS INTERNATIONAL LAW SCHOOL - ASIA LIMITED, created a LL.M in International Business Law and joins its forces with INSEAD, the well-known Management School, to create the International School of Business Law, in order to offer a multidisciplinary education, with an international dimension.

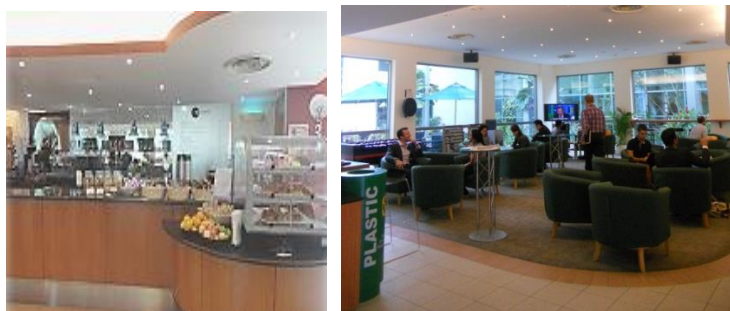

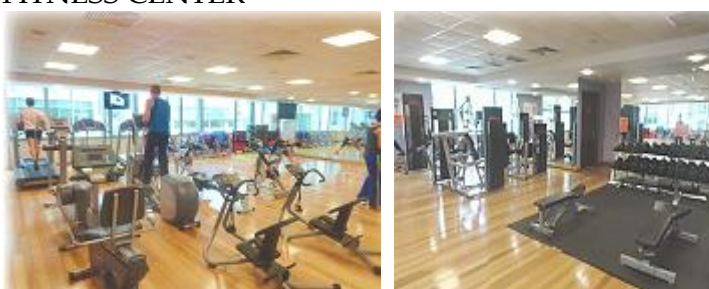

Full Professor in Private International Law, Marie Goré is Professor at Paris II University (Panthéon-Assas), where she manages the Exchange Programs with China, Cambodia, Korea and Vietnam.

She teaches Private International Law and Comparative law. Considered as an expert in these fields, she is the author of numerous publications on these subjects and has frequently been invited as Visiting Professor in many countries of various areas (US, Asia and Europe). President of the Asian Section of the French Comparative Law Society, she is also Member of the French Committee for Private International Law and Vice-president of HERNI Capitant Association of Friends of French legal Culture. She very often gives lectures in international colloquium and serves regularly as a consultant for domestic or foreign companies.



Professor Laurence Idot: Competition Law



PhD in Law (1981)

Agrégée des Facultés de Droit (1982), teaches EC and Competition Law for post-graduate students at University Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne (1993-2007) and University Paris II Panthéon-Assas (since 2007). Her other fields of interest include arbitration law and private international law, and their interaction with competition law.

She is also co-director of the monthly review *Europe* (1991), director of the scientific committee of the review *Concurrences* (2004), and a member of advisory boards of several reviews, such the *Common Market Law Review*. She has an active role in many academic associations and is the President of the French Association on Competition Law (AFEC) as well as one of the French NGA for the ICN. These last five years, she has devoted quite a few articles as well as a book (Bruylant, 2004) to European competition reform. Mrs. Idot has also experience as a practitioner, a consultant, and an arbitrator.

She was appointed as a member of the “Authority of Concurrence” early 2009.

Member of the Board of the French Committee for Arbitration, he is also Member of the French Committee for Private International Law and Member of the the ICC Court of Arbitration’s Panel of Arbitrators.

He is a very well-known arbitrator and serves very often in international Arbitral Tribunals (as Chairman, co-arbitrator or sole arbitrator; ad hoc and institutional arbitration: ICC, UNCITRAL, AFA, CEPANI, etc.).

Full Professor in Private Law, Thierry Bonneau is Professor at Paris II University (France), where he is responsible for the mission quality-assessment and takes part in several degree programs for foreign students.

He teaches Banking Law, Financial market Law, Banking and Financial European and international regulation. Considered as an expert in these fields, he is the author of several books and numerous articles on these subjects. He is a columnist for several law journals.

One of the columns is related to financial European and international law.

Panel member in several French (Banque et droit; Bulletin joly bourse; Corporate Finance and Capital Markets Law Review) and English (International Financial Regulation Review (IFIN), which is published by BNA International) law magazines and encyclopedia (Encyclopaedia of Banking Law, which is published by Lexisnexis UK), he is co-director of one of them (*Revue de droit bancaire et financier*) and a board member of European Society for banking law and financial Law.

He also gives lectures in several countries and serves as a consultant for large international law firms, domestic or foreign companies.

He is Chair of the French Association of territorial Law, member of Council for Guidance and assessment of the French Institute for PPP (I.G.D.) and Chair of the Public-Private Partnerships Professionnal School.

Jean-Pierre Mattout’s is member of the Paris bar and his practice primarily focuses on national and international banking and financial transactions, mergers and acquisitions, company law and corporate governance issues.

As former General Counsel of the Paribas Group, a position held for more than ten years, he participated directly in the formulation and implementation of many strategic operations, including large mergers and acquisitions. From 2002 until 2004, he was the General Counsel of the France Telecom Group. She is Professor of Law at the University Panthéon-Assas, (Paris II). After a double Law degree (LLB, King's College, London, Maîtrise of French Private Law, University Panthéon-Sorbonne, Paris I) she wrote a PHD in the field of Conflict of laws at the University Panthéon-Assas (Paris II) and obtained the Agrégation of private law in 1995. She has been Professor of Law at the University of Rouen (1995-1999), René Descartes (Paris V) (1999-2002) and Panthéon-Assas, Paris II

where she is currently teaching.

She is and Vice President of the International Academy of Comparative Law. She is an active member of worldwide famous international and European groups in the field of contract law : the Unidroit group which is preparing a third edition of the Unidroit Principles of International Commercial Contracts (she is reporter of the Chapter on condition), the Study Group on a European Civil Code (2001-2009) and the Hague conference on Private international law group on choice of law in international contracts (created in 2009).

She has directed important academic work on the codification of European contract law in France (within the Société de législation comparée and the Association Henri Capitant). She (droit international privé).

Her main fields of publications are comparative law, conflict of laws and contract law. She is the scientific director of a famous weekly law review, the Recueil Dalloz.

Professor Jean-Christophe Galloux: Intellectual Property



Professor Jean-Christophe Galloux (Dr. iur., LL.M. EUI Florence) teaches intellectual property law, competition and contract laws in connection with IP at the Law faculty of Panthéon-Assas (Paris II, Sorbonne Universités) and at the International Center for Intellectual Property (CEIPI Strasbourg).

He also heads the Intellectual Property Research Institute (IRPI) of Paris (Paris Chamber of Commerce).

He has been visiting professor in these matters at numerous universities: Montréal (Canada), Casablanca (Marocco), Bahrein, Budapest (ELTE), München (LMU and Max-Planck Institute), Tokyo (Toddaï) and Moscow (MGU), Saint Petersburg, OAPI (Yaoundé), etc.

He is the author of more than 220 publications in intellectual property law, competition law, pharmaceutical and biotechnology law. He recently published several books in particular with Pr. Jacques Azema "Droit de la propriété industrielle" (Collection "Précis", Dalloz, 1 100 pages, 7th ed. 2012), which is the leading academic book in this field.

He has been an adviser to the European Commission, UNESCO and OECD for IP matters, a member of the European Ethic Committee for the European Federation of Biotech Industries

(EUROPABIO) in Brussels (1999-2003) and of several academic boards among others Max Planck's MIPLC (Munich). He practices intellectual property matters as a member of Paris bar since 1984, mediator and arbitrator. Prof. Dr. Galloux has been elected in 2013 as a member of the National Academy of Pharmacy.

Professor Benoit Delaunay: Tax Law



Benoît Delaunay is full Professor of Public and Tax Law at the University of Panthéon-Assas Paris II (Sorbonne Universités) where he manages the professional Master program in International Tax Law.

He is *agrégé des facultés de droit* and graduated Sciences Po Paris, HEC school of management and obtained his PhD *summa cum laude*.

He has been visiting professor in several universities in different countries (Italy, Spain, South Korea, UAE...). He teaches Public Economic Law, Tax Law and International Tax Law.

He is member of the Scientific Committee of the *International Fiscal Association* and has been a member of the national French Committee on Tax Law and Environmental issues.

He is recognized as an expert in the *Who's Who Legal Corporate Tax*. He wrote nearly a hundred of articles, notes and contributions to books.

(m-i) Delivery: all courses offered in Singapore are delivered via face-to-face lectures held at our Singapore campus.

(m-ii) Admission requirements: admission to Sorbonne-Assas International Law School Asia in LLM Business International Law School is highly selective. Normal entrance requirements include: a master's degree in Law (or equivalent) or alternative diploma and four year's professional experience; and English proficiency.

- (ii) final exam for each module
- (iii) oral examination or written or student case
- (iv) each of the 10 modules is graded out of 20 to graduate student, the student must obtain 100 out of 200.

On a scale of 20, students must therefore obtain 10 to graduate.

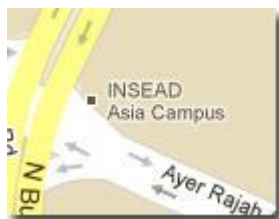

The Sorbonne-Assas International Law School is hosted by INSEAD, located 15 minutes from financial district and 30 minutes from Changi Airport.

The Asia campus is located at the corner of the Ayer Rajah Avenue and North Buona Vista Road in the Knowledge Hubs district of Singapore.

The best ways of getting here are by taxi or public transport.

From airport:

Changi airport is only about 30 minutes from INSEAD. We then suggest you take a taxi to the campus.

Taxis are a relatively cheap and convenient means of transport in Singapore, and are readily available 24hrs. From the airport you have a choice of normal taxis (metered) or Limo taxis (flat fare) just follow relevant signs and specify INSEAD, 1 Ayer Rajah Avenue as your destination.

By Car

From City, take the AYE towards Jurong and exit at North Buona Vista Road. Turn right upon exit, take North Buona Vista Road. INSEAD is at the corner of Ayer Rajah Avenue and North Buona Vista Road.

From Jurong, take the AYE towards City and exit at North Buona Vista Road. Turn left upon exit, take North Buona Vista Road. INSEAD is at the corner of Ayer Rajah Avenue and North Buona Vista Road.

There is a free open-air car-park at INSEAD (78 spaces).

By Train - (MRT network)

Sorbonne-Assas International Law School is on the MRT network and with the station exit within metres of our entrance; it could not be more convenient.
